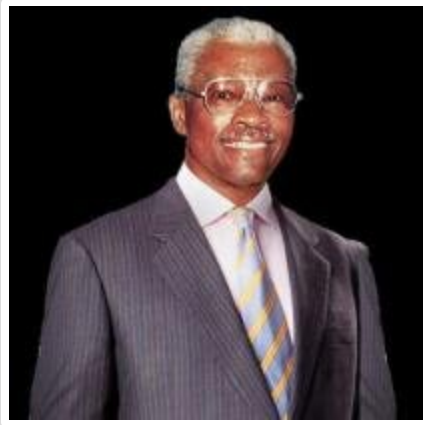




Mr Hamlin Goffney Jr

Hamlin Goffney Jr. was born on September 6, 1928 in Huntsville, Texas to the late Hambin and Cleo Patra Johnson Goffney. He was the second of six boys and one girl born to this union.

When the family moved to Houston, Texas, Hamlin enrolled at Jack Yates High School and was an honor student in his grade. After graduation, he enlisted in the U.S. Army serving his allotted time. He was discharged in November 8, 1952. By this time, he met and married Doretha Williams in December 1952 and two children were born to this union.

He confessed a hope in Christ and belonged to The Fourth Missionary Baptist Church where his mother, father and siblings belonged under Rev. E.S. Branch. Hamlin later joined the Pilgrim Rest Missionary Baptist Church with his family. He served as deacon chairman until his health began to fail. He loved his church.

Early in his life, he attended Texas Southern University as a business major. At the same time, he was working at the Houston Packing Company along with his father until the company defaulted.

Hamlin started a career at the Anhauser Brewing Company and retired from there with thirty years. It was said that the company had to hire two people to

do his job when he retired.

Hamlin Goffney Jr. was such a gentle, yet strong giant in his assignment on earth. Anything he was assigned to, he did with great honor and dutifulness. His life represented humility, faithfulness, devotion, and service as evidenced in all that he did and accomplished in his life. His welcoming smile showed his kind heart, soul and immense love for people, always putting others before himself.
